Whoever wishes to remain safe from temptation [in these final days of the earth] should stand firm in true faith in Christ, fervent in prayer, eagerly and obediently listening to God's Word, thanking him from the bottom of his heart for that, lest God be angered and withdraw his hand, allowing the devil to slip in.

The devil, as said, is such a crafty, powerful spirit that, even though you once understood everything and knew the whole Bible, you would fall and be lost, were God not supporting and upholding you.

That is certainly true should the Muslim continue as he began, that the whole world would fall victim to the Mohammedan faith.

THANKSGIVING, YES, BUT SO MUCH MORE!

November is the month of Thanksgiving Day.

But Thanksgiving Day is not the *main* thing happening for the Christian Church in November. (Actually, Thanksgiving Day is a secular holiday made official by the U.S. Congress for religious purposes, but did not originate with the Church.)

For liturgical churches that follow the Christian Church Year, November is when we focus on the End Times of this world.

How will this world end?

What will happen when Jesus returns?

When will the end come?

What if I'm already dead when that hap-

pens?

These are the Sundays we observe by which our questions are answered:

Nov. 4 - Reformation Sunday: This year we will be observing it as "Invite a Friend Sunday," but our focus will still be on the free forgiveness earned by Jesus and given to us by God through faith as rediscovered by Martin Luther 500 years ago. We are and will remain in the "Church Militant" until the Last Day and we will have to struggle to preserve the truth of Scripture from being lost.

Nov. 11 - Last Judgment: Every soul who has ever lived on earth will have to appear before Christ on the Last Day. All who relied on

Christ will be taken to heaven. Those who did not will be condemned to hell.

Nov. 18 - Saints Triumphphant: We celebrate the victory that Christ has won for us and that believers who have died are already enjoying. We observe a special rite remembering Peace members who have died this past year.

Nov. 25 - Christ the King: This is the last Sunday of the Church Year and the culmination of all the Sundays, indeed of our very salvation. Christ is King! For eternity we will acknowledge Him in glory.

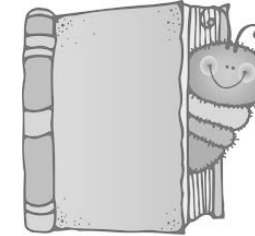
PEACE LUTHERAN SCHOOL LIVING HISTORY NIGHT

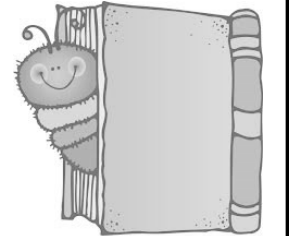
