THEME: ADVENT 2 CHRIST IS COMING! REPENT

Today is the second Sunday of the season of the Church Year we call Advent. The word Advent means “coming.” In Advent we anticipate three ‘comings’ of Christ – He came as a baby in Bethlehem, He comes to us now in Word and Sacrament, He will come again visibly on the Last Day. The themes of the four Sundays of Advent are as follows:

1 Be Ready. 2 Repent. 3 Rejoice. 4 Revealed.

Today, we hear the call: **Repent**. **Repent** was the message of all the Old Testament prophets as they called God’s people back to His Word and the promise that the Savior would day come. **Repent** was the message St. John the Baptizer used to prepare the people of Israel for the good news the Savior and His Kingdom of peace had arrived in the person of Jesus Christ. **Repent** would be the very same message that Jesus and His Apostles would proclaim.

In its most basic and often used form in Scripture **Repentance** has two parts. **Repent** means to believe that we are sinners who deserve God’s judgment and cannot save ourselves. **Repent** also means to believe that God has saved us freely through the redeeming work of Jesus’ perfect life, innocent death and resurrection. Such **repentance** that trusts in Christ alone as the Savior will, just like a living tree, produce fruit (good works) that flow from and are evidence of saving faith.

THE ADVENT WREATH

Each week of Advent, a candle is lit. As the light grows, we are reminded how God gave successive promises about the coming Savior through the prophets, providing more and more details about the Savior until at his birth “the true light that gives light to every man” had arrived into this world (John 1:9). The round wreath of evergreen symbolizes the eternal life Jesus brings: in Him was life, and the life was the light of mankind (John 1:4).

CONFSSION

Dear friends, let us approach God with a true heart and confess our sins, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to forgive us.

Lord of life, I confess that I am by nature dead in sin.

For faithless worrying and selfish pride,

For sins of habit and sins of choice,

For the evil I have done and the good I have failed to do,

You should cast me away from your presence forever;

O Lord, I am sorry for my sins. Forgive me, for Jesus' sake.¹

ABSOLUTION

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. In his great mercy, God made us alive in Christ even when we were dead in our sins. Hear the word of Christ through his called servant: I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son \dagger and of the Holy Spirit.

¹ The confession of sins gives voice to our repentance. Note how we confess that all we have is sin and evil and deserve only God's judgment. Note how our plea for forgiveness is not found in ourselves, but only in the Lord's goodness in sending Jesus. Note how the absolution (pronouncement of forgiveness) is based on the facts of what Jesus has done for us.

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light:

On those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned. (*Isaiah 9:2*)

John the Baptist called out in the wilderness: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is near."

"Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him." (*Matthew 3:2,3*)

Christ himself has given us the power for repentance. By his holy life and innocent death he has conquered Satan and sin and is able to help us when we are tempted. (*Hebrews 2:18*)

He reigns in our lives with his grace and bring us to eternal life. (*Romans 5:21*)


Let us pray.



SECOND READING

Romans 15:4-13

⁴Indeed, whatever was written in the past was written for our instruction, so that, through patient endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures, we would have hope. ⁵And may God, the source of patient endurance and encouragement, grant that you agree with one another in accordance with Christ Jesus, ⁶so that with one mind, in one voice, you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

⁷For this reason, accept one another as Christ also accepted you to the glory of God. ⁸For I am saying that Christ became a servant of those who are circumcised for the sake of God's truth, to confirm the promises made to the patriarchs. ⁹He also did this so that the Gentiles would glorify God for his mercy, as it is written:

For this reason I will praise you among the Gentiles,
and I will sing to your name.

¹⁰And again it says:

Rejoice, you Gentiles, with his people.

¹¹And again:

Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles,

² Today's acclamation verse is Luke 3:4,6. John's ministry was foretold 700 years in advance through Isaiah as one of the many signs to prove the true Savior (Messiah) had arrived.

GOSPEL**Matthew 3:1-12**

¹In those days, John the Baptist appeared, preaching in the wilderness of Judea and saying, ²“Repent, because the kingdom of heaven is near!” ³Yes, this is he of whom this was spoken through the prophet Isaiah:

A voice of one crying out in the wilderness,
“Prepare the way of the Lord. Make his paths straight.”

⁴John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. ⁵Then Jerusalem, all of Judea, and all the region around the Jordan were going out to him. ⁶They were baptized by him in the Jordan River as they confessed their sins. ⁷But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming for his baptism, he said to them, “You offspring of vipers, who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? ⁸Therefore produce fruit in keeping with repentance! ⁹Do not think of saying to yourselves, ‘We have Abraham as our father.’ For I tell you that God is able to raise up children for Abraham from these stones. ¹⁰Already the ax is ready to strike the root of the trees. So every tree that does not produce good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. ¹¹I baptize you with water for repentance. But the one who comes after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹²His winnowing shovel is in his hand, and he will thoroughly clean out his threshing floor. He will gather his wheat into the barn, but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire.”

Back to Basics

Of Repentance they³ teach that for those who have fallen after Baptism there is forgiveness of sins whenever they are brought to repentance and that the Church ought to impart absolution to those who return to repentance. Now, properly speaking, repentance consists of these two parts:

One is contrition, that is, terrors that strike the conscience when sin is recognized; The other is faith, which is born of the Gospel, or of absolution, and believes that sins are forgiven on account of Christ, comforts the conscience, and delivers it from terrors.

Thereupon good works, which are the fruit of repentance, should follow, as John says in Matthew 3: "Bear fruit worthy of repentance."

³ That is, the teachers and preachers of the Reformation. They would eventually be called 'Lutherans,' but would have more likely referred to themselves as 'Evangelical,' which means 'those who proclaim the gospel.'

May others see the love of Christ in our words and actions.

Loving Lord, work in us during this Advent season so that our joy may be genuine and may rest in the promises of the King who comes to save.

Come, Lord Jesus. Amen.
